General requirements for single, young women between 18 and 24 years old, include good character, poise, personality, intelligence, charm and beauty of face and figure. Either amateur or professional talent is permissable in the three-minute routine which

may be expressed in a variety of ways including singing, dancing, playing a musical instrument, giving a dramatic reading, art display, explaining dress designing or in other ways. A talk on a career which one wishes to follow may be used, also.

Entrant must never have been married, divorced or had marriage annulled and must be a high school graduate by Sept. 1 of this year and as of Sept. 1, shall not be less than 18 nor more than 28.
